

Our school works hard to keep children and young people safe. Everyone in the school is responsible for protecting children and young people from harm.

Children and young people at our school do not need to feel worried, scared, or anxious that something harmful will happen to them.

All adults in our school have a responsibility to care for children and young people, to promote their wellbeing, and to protect them from any form of abuse.

The school has a Child Safety Policy to help us make safe choices about what happens in the school.



They should feel comfortable to speak with a teacher or staff member they trust if they feel unsafe or if they need help. All students can trust the adults will listen to them.

If a student talks about something that is making them feel unsafe, the information will only be shared with people who can protect them and those who have the right, or need, to know.



We create opportunities for young people to have voice and agency and encourage empowerment of young people. We strive to ensure that their rights are heard, and that their discussions are taken seriously.



It is important that students share the responsibility with keeping children and young people safe at our school. Students are included in the Child Safe Committees at the school and are encouraged to participate in the development of practices and processes that can be used to promote and educate. Students can play a big role in how everyone at the school can feel and be safe. Some simple behaviours young people can practise, which allow others to feel safe, are:

- No bullying
- No put downs of others
- · Respectful use of language
- · Appropriate use of social media
- · Telling a trusted adult when they see behaviours that make people feel unsafe
- Get involved when student committees and student leadership opportunities come up



The school looks out for problems or things that might be unsafe and then, if there are any problems, they try to fix them as soon as they can.

We should always tell someone if we see a risk.



Some of the things we do to make sure they are right for the school are:

- Check if there is a police criminal record
- Check that they have a Working with Children Check
- Make sure they sign the Code of Conduct
- Make sure they follow the rules
- Mr Brockhus and staff on interview panels talk to the people that worked with them last to see if they are safe people

All staff get training about keeping children and young people safe.



We have a Code of Conduct that explains the behaviours that everyone in the school needs to follow.

The Code of Conduct is available on the College Website and on Schoolbox - Parent Portal.

These rules affect adults as well as children. Salesian College Sunbury makes sure there is a Code of Conduct for:

- All teachers
- All adults working in the school
- · All casual relief teachers
- All contractors on site
- Volunteers
- Priests



If there are times when an adult has been unsafe with you or with another child, you can tell a teacher or any adult at our school. They will know what to do to help.

You should always tell a staff member you trust if you think there is a risk. It is important that the child at risk is helped and feels safe.



We encourage families and our wider community to be actively involved in promoting child safety standards. We provide child safety material and create an open and transparent culture for discussing and understanding these topics.

Sometimes, students will need special support to keep them safe and make sure they feel cared for. We help and look after ALL students, including:

- · Students with different beliefs
- Students who like different things
- · Students of all ages
- Students who have different abilities
- · Students who have different ways of learning
- Students with different personalities and interests
- · Students of all genders
- · Students of all sexual orientations
